The Va. Department of Forestry Conference Center also has overnight accommodations.

The Conference Center and Guest Rooms opened in 2006. The DOF conference facilities are self-supporting and receive no taxpayer funds for our operation. The facilities are available to government and natural resource organizations, as well as for rental by private groups for social events and retreats.

Guest rooms offer twin beds. There are fifteen double rooms and one handicap accessible single room. Bathrooms have walk in showers, plus a separate sink and vanity area. We provide cable TV, coffee makers, hair dryers, ironing boards and irons, clock radio, and writing desk with telephone. All towels and linens are provided. The NKTCC does not offer housekeeping service if you are staying multiple nights, however, arrangements can be made in advance for additional linen and towels.

You are welcome to enjoy our Nature Trail and access to the Chickahominy River during your stay.
